

Conference Review Guidelines

Conference reviews synthesize new ideas emerging from conference presentations on topics related to the brain, language, and music attended by the author. The author may also add their own thoughts and comments about the conference, as well as interesting points of the conference.

Here is a checklist of all elements that should be present in your manuscript:

- My manuscript is in layman terms and without scientific jargon explaining a conference I have attended with a topic that is related to the CRBLM.
- My manuscript has references in APA Style.
- My manuscript is factual and does not contain biases nor my opinion.
- My manuscript summarizes the highlights of the conference and includes my own thoughts and comments on it.
- My manuscript has between 500-1000 words.
- My manuscript is in Times New Roman 12-point font and double spaced
- Titles and subtitles in my manuscript are in **bold**.
- I used an active voice in my text and have proper grammar.
- *The structure of my article is as follows:*
 - *Title* in **bold**
 - *Lead:* 5 to 8 sentences answering the 5Ws (Who, What, Where, When, Why)
 - *Section titles* in **bold** to introduce various aspects of my manuscript
 - *Body of your manuscript:* 2 to 4 paragraphs presenting the various aspects of my manuscript
 - *Conclusion:* Paragraph that sums up my manuscript
- I found at least one image to act as visual aid for my manuscript named according to the Author Instructions document.
- I have read and followed the Author Instructions document for more formatting details.
